



## Rules

- 1 All classification and judging will be based upon the British Cactus & Succulent Society publication "Handbook of Shows," 10th Edition.
- 2 All classes are open to all members of the British Cactus & Succulent Society and The Haworthia Society, subject to rule 16.
- 3 All entries must be the *bona fide* property of the exhibitor.
- 4 Exhibitors may enter up to THREE exhibits in each class.
- 5 All entry forms must reach the Show Secretary not later than Thursday 4 October 2018
- 6 All exhibits must be staged between 9.00am and 11.00am on Sunday 7 October 2018 and must remain until the close of the Show at 4.00pm.
- 7 The decision of the Judges will be final. At the Judges' discretion, awards may be withheld if the number or quality of exhibits in any class is deemed to be below standard.
- 8 Any protest must be delivered in writing to the Show Manager not later than 2.30pm on the day of the Show.
- 9 Any means of identification between exhibitor and exhibit may render the exhibitor liable to disqualification for all entries.
- 10 Liability: all exhibits, personal property etc., will be at the risk of the exhibitor. The Birmingham & District Branch of the BCSS accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage whatsoever, but all reasonable care will be taken.
- 11 Labelling: wherever possible, plants should be correctly and legibly named. This is not compulsory, but a correct name is desirable.
- 12 Round pot size is the diameter measured at the top, inside rim. Square pot size is the length measured along one side of the top, inside the rim.
- 13 All cups and trophies are perpetual and must be returned in good order to the Show Manager before or at the next Autumn Show.
- 14 Class entry cards will be available on the morning of the Show.
- 15 When calculating points gained by an exhibitor the following system will be used:  
First - 5 points Second - 3 points Third - 2 points HC - 1 point
- 16 Novices, including juniors, and those adjudged by the Show Manager to be inexperienced at competitive showing, may enter classes 48-49.
- 17 At the Birmingham branch sales table 15% commission will be charged to those members selling plants. Cash for sales will not be paid out on the day of the show but as soon as is practicable afterwards.
- 18 All Haworthia classes will be judged in accordance with the Guide to Shows Edition No.10.
- 19 For the purpose of the show, Haworthiad is defined as a plant belonging to the following genera: Haworthia, Poellnitzia, Astroloba and Chortolirion.
- 20 Entrance to the Show constitutes acceptance of the above rules.
- 21 Exhibits should not contain more than one plant per container
